Grade Level: 11, 12

Homework

- Homework will be assigned every night with few exceptions. Homework will require an average of 1.5 hours per block.
- Little class time will be devoted to answering homework questions. Students may either stay after school or collaborate with classmates to answer their homework questions.
- Homework will be checked for completion, not for correctness.
- All work must be shown to receive credit.
- Homework will be accepted one class period late with no penalty.

Late Work

- Late classwork and late homework will be accepted one class period late with no penalty.
- Make up quizzes/tests and projects submitted after the due date will be penalized 5 points for each late day.

Explanation of Zeroes

- A “o” in the gradebook indicates that the assignment has been graded, but was either not turned in or earned zero credit. An “X” in the gradebook indicates the student is exempt from that assignment. A “Z” in the gradebook means the assignment was not turned in and currently not calculated in the total average; however, if the assignment is not turned in, a zero will be given.

- Empty spaces in the gradebook indicate that the assignment has not been graded, but soon will be.

Reassessment

Students will be given the opportunity for reassessments provided that:

- They have completed 80% of home and class assignments.
- They have completed an established remediation process, such as tutoring from the teacher, completing test review components on IXL, or making test corrections on original test/quiz.

***The maximum recovery grade is 90%.**

Make-up Work

- Timely completion of all assignments is required.
- Academic support will be used as necessary to insure assignment completion.
- Students will have one week upon the day of return to make up missed assessments.
- It is the student's responsibility to schedule a make-up date and time with the teacher.

Extra Credit

Students will have the opportunity to earn points on unit tests by attending after school study sessions.
