Homework

Homework is rarely assigned, but students are encouraged to sketch and research on their own.

Late Work

It is the responsibility of the student to complete and hand in ALL assignments. All late work is due prior to the end of the 9 weeks and may be completed and turned in without penalty for being late.

Explanation of Zeroes

- A 0 in the gradebook that indicates that the assignment has been graded, but was either not turned in or earned zero credit. A X in the gradebook, the student is exempt from that assignment. A Z in the gradebook means the assignment was not turned in and currently not calculated in the total average; however, if the assignment is not turned in, a zero will be given.
- Empty spaces in the gradebook indicate that the assignment has not been graded, but soon will be.
- Any student with a “D” or “E” average will have their parent/guardian contacted by the teacher.

Reassessment

Students may redo artwork and/or assignments to improve success. Once the artwork or assignment has been redone, the student must submit the artwork or assignment with the original rubric and put “regrade” on the rubric.

Make-up Work

- Timely completion of all assignments is required.
- The student must obtain information needed to make up missed work and are expected to make up all work by the end of each nine weeks.

- Completing missed work may require the student to come in before school, after school, or make special arrangements with the teacher.

Academic detentions will be used as necessary to insure assignment completion.

Extra Credit

Students may earn extra credit for completing extension activities for projects and are assigned on request. Extra credit assignments are worth 5 points and must be completed outside of class.
