Homework

There is no homework assigned for this class unless students do not finish assignments in class during the allotted time, or to study for quizzes and tests

Late Work

Assignments that were not turned in on the day they were due will be accepted with 10% penalty no more than one week from the date it was due

Explanation of Zeroes

A 0 in the grade book indicates that the assignment has been graded, but was either not turned in or earned a zero credit.

An X in the gradebook means the student is exempt from that assignment.

A Z in the gradebook means the assignment was not turned in and currently not calculated in the total average; however, if the assignment is not turned in, a zero will be given.

Empty spaces in the gradebook means that the assignment has not been graded, but soon will be.

Reassessment

Students will be allowed to retake test and quizzes if:

-they have completed all home and class assignments

-they have completed an established remediation process, such as, tutoring from the computer programming teacher, reviewed and made test corrections on original test/quiz

The teacher will give a 2 week window once tests are returned for retakes

New grade will be recorded and old grade discarded

Make-up Work

Timely completion of all assignments is required

A student who was absent on the day the homework, programming exercises, test, or quiz was given will have one week from the day they return to school to complete the missed work.

If a student does not make up their work within one week from an absence, it will then be considered late work and the late work policy will be applied.

Academic support will be given as necessary to ensure assignment completion.
