Grade Level: 9 – 12

Homework

- Assignments will be given as needed to reinforce what is covered in class.
- Students will be required to complete a minimum of 30 minutes per week of Rosetta Stone practice in some WL classes and levels. This practice is to enhance classroom instruction. Students will have opportunities to complete Rosetta Stone after school, during study block or at home.

Late Work

Students are expected to meet all deadlines for assignments. Late work will result in minus 5 points for each class that it is late.

Explanation of Zeroes

- A 0 in the gradebook indicates that the assignment has been graded, but was either not turned in or earned zero credit. An X in the gradebook, the student is exempt from that assignment. A Z in the gradebook means the assignment was not turned in and currently not calculated in the total average; however, if the assignment is not turned in, a zero will be given.
- Empty spaces in the gradebook indicate that the assignment has not been graded, but soon will be.
- Any student with a “D” or “E” average will have their parent/guardian contacted by the teacher.

Reassessment

Students who have not demonstrated mastery on a summative performance-based assessment, will be expected to attend remediation session(s) and will be offered an alternated assignment to determine comprehension.

Make-up Work

Students will be expected to make up assignments as soon as returning to class. In the event of multiple absences, the teacher and student will determine a reasonable time for make-up work.

Extra Credit

Extra credit will be given at the discretion of the teacher to encourage participation in cultural activities pertaining to the language class and/or to offer opportunities which may enhance the grade for the topic currently being taught. Extra credit, if offered, will be available to all students.
